Falkirk & Linlithgow Hockey Club (FALHC) is a community sports club operating across Falkirk and West Lothian Districts. This document will provide you with an introduction to the club, as well as information for new and existing members, or parents and guardians of our Junior members.

FALHC was formed in May 2017 from a merger of 3 separate clubs that worked collaboratively but were recognised as distinct entities with their own committees, objectives and plans. When Falkirk GHG Men, Linlithgow Ladies and Linlithgow Juniors came together to form FALHC, a single club was created that provided hockey opportunities for **everyone** –boys and girls from primary school age upwards, with distinct pathways from picking up a stick for the first time, through our junior hockey academy, into competitive adult hockey with the potential to play at a variety of levels to match current and future capabilities.

We have 7 senior teams (3 ladies and 4 mens), Junior teams at U8, U10, U12 and U14, over 280 members, and a focus on inclusivity and community engagement, supported by strong governance.



The **SCOTTISH HOCKEY** membership categories are:

Registration Category	Fee	Conditions
Adult	£48	All individuals over the age of 18, who participate in ANY on field activity organised by Scottish Hockey or affiliated district (eg EAST for us) including player, coach, manager, umpire, physio, etc.
U18	£25	Any player under 18 on 1 st January on the season of registration (i.e. u18 on 1 st January 2025 for the 25/26 season) participating in senior club hockey
Club Support	£12	Any individual NOT involved in on field activity organised by Scottish Hockey or affiliated district. Eg.Treasurer, secretary, Parent helper at club training sessions. If the individual holds dual roles – eg Parent Helper at junior training AND a player or umpire, the should register as an ADULT.
Casual	£12	Any non-regular player, who plays UP TO 3 games. After 3 they must become an ADULT member.
Youth	£5	Any player under the age of 18 only participating in youth hockey. This includes training, festivals, games, tournaments, and u14s playing development friendlies.

The registration fees are paid directly to Scottish Hockey. Club membership fees are separate and have been updated to reflect this change in registration. Individuals should change their category as required. Eg. Casual playing more than 3 games -> Adult, Youth member turning 14 and playing Senior matches -> U18.

Both senior sections operate 2 membership categories, which include all training, games and registration with East District. Scottish Hockey membership (inc group insurance) is paid directly to Scottish Hockey via the Sport:80 membership portal.

Club Membership is managed via the Teamo app, which requires ALL members to be registered, and have a valid direct debit mandate in place to enable the app to take payments.

If there are any individuals that do not believe that they fit into one of the categories noted below, or are having difficulty paying their fees, they should speak in confidence to the treasurer.

Club memberships have been updated to reflect the change in registration with Scottish Hockey, and a switch from 12 payments to 10 to better reflect the season calendar.

Club colours are:

- Sky tops
- Navy shorts/skorts
- Navy socks



Where there may be a clash of colours, our change kit will be red tops and/or red socks. When attending matches, you should ensure that you have your change top and socks.



All members are expected to own/have access to both home and change items of club equipment.

Shinguards **MUST** be worn at training and matches. Gumshields and hand-protectors are **strongly encouraged**.

Facemasks are provided to all senior teams to defend penalty corners. From 25/26 all players defending a penalty corner **MUST** wear a facemask.

Players with long hair should ensure that it is tied back, to ensure that it does not impede their vision or cause a distraction than may result in injury.
