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Club Code of Conduct

Members and Guests of Beacon Hockey Club are required to abide by the provisions of this Code of Conduct and subsequent updates as may be made from time to time, and by their presence on club premises or at club events or activities are deemed to have accepted and to abide by the provisions of this Code of Conduct and all rules or regulations that the Club has adopted.

Members and Guests include all members and officers of Beacon Hockey Club and all guests of those members and officers, as well as all individuals and parents or guardians who watch, attend, participate or officiate in matches hosted by the Club in whatever capacity.

If a breach of the provisions or principles of this Code of Conduct occurs, or is reasonably suspected to have occurred, the Committee reserves the right to take such action as it deems appropriate, including but not limited to exclusion, suspension or termination of membership. Any disciplinary or complaint hearings in connection with a breach of the Code of Conduct shall be dealt with in accordance with the Club Constitution.

All Members and Guests of Beacon Hockey Club will:

- Respect the rights, dignity and worth of every person within the context of hockey.
- Treat everyone equally and not discriminate on the grounds of age, gender, disability, race, ethnic origin, nationality, colour, parental or marital status, religious belief, class or social background, sexual preference or political belief.
- Not condone, or allow to go unchallenged, any form of discrimination if witnessed.
- Display high standards of behaviour.
- Promote the positive aspects of hockey, e.g. fair play.
- Officials and coaches shall conform to the England Hockey Code of Conduct.
- Encourage all participants to learn the <u>laws and rules of the game</u> and play within them, respecting the decisions of match officials.
- Actively discourage unfair play, rule violations and arguing with match officials.
- Recognise good performance not just match results.
- Place the well-being and safety of juveniles above the development of performance.
- Ensure that activities are appropriate for the age, maturity, experience and ability of the individual.
- Respect children's opinions when making decisions about their participation in hockey.

 Not smoke, drink or use banned substances whilst actively working with juveniles in the club environment.

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- Not provide juveniles with alcohol when they are under the care of the Club.
- Follow England Hockey, league and child protection guidelines.

All Players agree to:

- Abide by the <u>rules</u> and spirit of the game.
- Not use deliberate or dangerous play, poor sportsmanship or foul language.
- Show respect and courtesy at all times to coaches, umpires, team-mates, opponents and parents/guardians. For the avoidance of doubt, verbal or physical abuse of teammates, opponents, or match officials is not acceptable.
- Treat all players as they would like to be treated and not interfere with, bully or take unfair advantage of any player.
- Respect match officials' decisions.
- Follow the directions of coaches, both for their safety and the safety of others.
- Be gracious in victory and defeat. Fun, enjoyment and skill development are the most important parts of the game.
- Be punctual at all times.
- Promptly communicate your availability for matches/training to coaches, captains and team managers.
- Treat equipment with respect, and respect the facilities provided by the Club.

All Junior Players agree to:

- Always do their best in training and matches, for the benefit of the team and club.
- Encourage, support and be positive towards other players at all times.
- Play fairly and within the rules and show good sportmanship.
- Respect the umpires and their decisons.
- Never engage in abusive language, bullying or intimidating behaviour.
- Be friendly and respectful towards opponents, team-mates and coaches.
- Win or lose with dignity, and congratulate the opposition at the end of the game, whatever the result.
- Not carry or use a mobile phone during matches or training without good reason (i.e. to arrange early collection by a parent/guardian).
- Listen carefully to what their coach tells them.
- Take responsibility for their personal safety by wearing a gum shield, shin pads and suitable footwear at all training sessions and matches.
- Turn up on time, prepared to play.
- Talk to someone they trust or the club's Safeguarding Officer (tap here to see their contact details) if they are unhappy about anything at the club.

All Parents/Guardians agree to:

- Always encourage and applaud good play for both teams.
- Never ridicule or shout at players.

• Provide positive verbal feedback both in training and during the game. Be aware that persistent, negative messages adversely affect players', coaches' and match officials' performance and attitude.

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- Support the Club in its efforts to eradicate loud, coarse and abusive behaviour from the game.
- Respect the coaches, umpires and club officials to set your child an example. Most of the staff at Beacon Hockey Club are unpaid volunteers.
- Support the coaches in instilling the virtues of fair play, sportsmanship, dignity and enjoyment.
- Encourage, not force, young people to play. Remember that players are taking part for enjoyment, not to please their parents/guardians. Hockey should be fun.
- Focus on the players' efforts rather than winning or losing.
- Ensure that the club has your emergency contact number(s).
- Share any concerns with club officials.
- Accompany their child to the playing area and make sure the coach or other officials
 are present, and that the session is going to go ahead before leaving, and ensure that
 arrangements have been made for their child to return home safely.

All Coaches and Team Managers agree to:

- Encourage a sense of fair play and sportsmanship and set a good example of sportsmanlike conduct.
- Recognise the importance of fun and enjoyment when coaching young players.
- Keep winning and losing in perspective, encouraging players to behave with dignity in all circumstances.
- Use appropriate language and refrain from inappropriate or foul language.
- Show respect and courtesy to players, umpires, opponents, parents/guardians and fellow coaches at all times.
- Not employ methods or practices that could involve risks to the health or development of players, fellow coaches or volunteers.
- Avoid the overplaying of the best players to the detriment of others, by using a squad system that gives all players a satisfactory amount of playing time.
- Ensure their knowledge and coaching strategies are up to date and in line with England Hockey philosophy.
- Be aware of, and abide by, the Club's and England Hockey's Safeguarding and Protecting Young People in Hockey Policy and associated guidance.
