GROUND REGULATIONS

Chadderton Football Club

These Ground Regulations shall apply to each Match taking place at the Ground. Entry to the Ground shall constitute acceptance of these Ground Regulations and the Rules and Regulations. These Ground Regulations incorporate the Club's Customer Charter (if any).

Definitions: "Club" means this football club, "Football Authorities" means the Football League, the Premier League, The Football Association, the Football Association of Wales, the league of which the Club is in membership from time to time, FIFA, UEFA and any other relevant governing body of association football. "Ground" means this football stadium and all locations owned, occupied or utilised by the Club. "Ground Regulations" means these ground regulations, as amended from time to time. "Match" means any association football match (or any part or aspect of such a match) taking place at the Ground. "Material" means any audio, digital, visual or audio-visual material or any information or data. "Rules and Regulations" means each of the rules and regulations of the Football Authorities that may be relevant to the Match, the Club and/or the Ground from time to time.

Entry to the Ground shall constitute acceptance of these Ground Regulations and the Rules as reprinted by a police officer and conviction could result in a Banning Order being made under and Regulations. Welcome to Chadderton Football Club, and our home, The Emplas Commercial North Stadium!


We are a football club that has recently been lucky enough to receive funding to have a brand-new 3G playing surface and new facilities at our home ground. We are delighted with how its all turned out and we hope it makes for some really exciting visits to our ground - for all fans.

If its your first time here at Chadderton FC, entry fee is taken on entry to the stadium, and can be paid in cash or card. Once in the stadium, you will be met with our carpark (which is free to use for paying fans), and our clubhouse. Our clubhouse is where our toilet facilities are, along with our bar and hospitality - just head upstairs if you are looking to grab a drink or take a seat in comfort, also be sure to enjoy the great view of the pitch from up there!

A bit further on from the clubhouse, if you carry on in the same direction, you will see one of our newest additions to our matchday experience here at Chadderton FC, Marlowes. Marlowes provides incredible matchday food for very reasonable prices and we cannot recommend trying them enough - try it and let us know what you think!

When the match starts, you have the freedom of all four sides of the pitch to choose where you would like to watch, the main stand is covered and offers seating, the area near the dugout allows you to get immersed with the game in a way you wouldn't experience at some levels, and there will also be quieter areas, which might be to others liking.

For fans looking to use public transport, The Emplas Commercial North Stadium is easy to reach by various methods. The nearest train station is Mills Hill, just over a mile away, with regular services from Manchester Victoria. Buses from both Oldham and Manchester city centre (such as the 59, 81, and 182) stop near Chadderton Precinct on Middleton Road, just a short walk from the ground.



Our Story

We are Chadderton Football Club, based in Chadderton, Oldham, Greater Manchester. Currently competing in the North West Counties League Premier Division, we play our home matches at The Emplas Commercial North Stadium, our newly refurbished home ground with a state of the art 4G playing surface.

Our story began in 1946, when we were formed as Burnley Lane Estate Juniors, competing in the Middleton Youth League. Just a year later, we expanded with an adult team, moved to Mill Brow, and became Millbrow Football Club.

A few years and relocations later, we adopted the name North Chadderton Amateurs, competing in the Oldham Amateur League. In 1954–55, we lifted the league's Challenge Cup, a sign of things to come. The following season, we moved up to the Manchester Amateur League and won the North Division title in 1955–56, before finally becoming Chadderton Football Club in 1957.

In 1963, we were crowned Division One champions, and in the same period, we began competing in Division Two of the Manchester League. After a series of strong finishes, we won that division in 1964–65, and again in 1966–67, earning promotion to the Premier Division.

By 1980, we had taken the step up to the Lancashire Combination, and just two years later, we became founding members of the North West Counties League Division Two.

Our first taste of promotion in that league came in 1988–89, finishing third in Division Two. But the Premier Division proved tough, and we dropped back down a year later. We bounced back again in 1991–92, and while we faced challenges — including demotion in 1997–98 due to ground grading issues — we've never stopped pushing forward.

In 2014–15, we came close to promotion via the play-offs, narrowly losing out to AFC Darwen. Fast forward to the 2022–23 season, and history was made: after finishing runners-up in Division One North, we earned promotion the hard way — with back-to-back penalty shootout victories over Euxton Villa and FC St Helens.

We've come a long way since those early days as a youth club. From local leagues to pushing up the pyramid, Chadderton Football Club continues to grow both on and off the pitch — driven by passion, community, and the ambition to build something lasting that we can all be proud to pass on to future generations.



Glossop North End

Today's visitors are Glossop North End – and few clubs in English football can boast a story quite like them. Founded in 1886, Glossop are one of the country's most historic clubs, carrying a legacy that stretches back to the very beginnings of organised league football.

The club emerged in the late Victorian era, initially playing friendly matches before entering competitive football in the North Cheshire League in 1890. Success followed quickly, and by the 1893/94 season Glossop had claimed the league championship, establishing themselves as a growing force in the region. Turning professional soon afterwards, the club progressed through The Combination and the Midland League, laying the foundations for one of the most remarkable chapters in their history.

That chapter arrived in 1898, when Glossop North End were elected to the Football League Second Division. In a stunning debut season, they finished runners-up and secured promotion to the First Division for the 1899/1900 campaign.



Although their stay in the top flight lasted just one season, it earned Glossop a unique place in football history as the smallest town ever to host top-division football. During this period the club was chaired by Sir Samuel Hill-Wood, who would later become a long-serving chairman of Arsenal, further linking Glossop to the wider story of the English game.

Following relegation, Glossop remained members of the Football League until the outbreak of the First World War in 1915. One of the highlights of this era came in 1908/09, when they enjoyed their best FA Cup run, reaching the quarter-finals.

After leaving the League, the club settled back into regional football, competing in competitions such as the Lancashire Combination and the Manchester League. Success continued at this level, including winning the Manchester League title in 1927/28.

A significant milestone came in 1955 with the move to Surrey Street, which remains the club's home to this day. Over the decades that followed, Glossop North End became a familiar and respected presence in the non-league pyramid, balancing competitiveness with a strong sense of community identity.

In 1982, the club became a founding member of the North West Counties Football League, adapting once again to league restructuring. Modern success arrived in memorable fashion with appearances at Wembley Stadium in the FA Vase finals of 2009 and 2015, occasions that remain treasured moments for players, supporters and the town alike.

The 2014/15 season stands out as a modern high point, as Glossop were crowned North West Counties League Premier Division champions, also lifting the league cup and earning promotion to the Northern Premier League.

After several seasons at that level, the club returned to the NWCFL Premier Division in 2023, continuing their long tradition of competing with pride and resilience.

Known as The Hillmen, Glossop North End wear their history lightly but proudly. From pioneering Football League members and First Division trailblazers to FA Vase finalists and league champions, their journey reflects the enduring spirit of non-league football — rooted in community, rich in heritage, and driven by an unmistakable passion for the game.
