## GROUND REGULATIONS Chadderton Football Club

These Ground Regulations shall apply to each Match taking place at the Ground. Entry to the Ground shall constitute acceptance of these Ground Regulations and the Rules and Regulations. These Ground Regulations incorporate the Club's Customer Charter (if any).

Definitions: "Club" means this football club, "Football Authorities" means the Football League, the Premier League, The Football Association, the Football Association of Wales, the league of which the Club is in membership from time to time, FIFA, UEFA and any other relevant governing body of association football, "Ground" means this football stadium and all locations owned, occupied or utilised by the Club, "Ground Regulations" means these ground regulations, as amended from time to time, "Match" means any association football match (or any part or aspect of such a match) taking place at the Ground, "Material" means any audio, digital, visual or audio-visual material or any information or data, "Rules and Regulations" means each of the rules and regulations of the Football Authorities that may be relevant to the Match, the Club and/or the Ground from time to time.

1. Entry to the Ground shall constitute acceptance of these Ground Regulations and the Rules and Regulations. Any person arrested by a police officer and conviction could result in a Banning Order being made under and Regulations. 4. The Club excludes, to the maximum extent permitted by law, any liability for loss, injury or damage to persons and property in or around the Ground. Nothing in these Ground Regulations 18. The Club reserves the right to nature without the express written approval of the Club, refuse admission to or eject from the Ground, any person who has transferred his/her ticket in

9. The following articles must not be brought within the Ground – knives, fireworks or any hazardous items, of any refusal of admission or ejection from the Ground no refund shall be payable. Tickets laser devices, glass bottles, glass vessels, cans, poles, any articles that are prohibited by them are the property of the Club at all times.

If any such behaviour, such person is under 18 years of age, the parent, guardian, responsible adult who is accompanying them) from the Ground. The Club may impose a ban (including, but not limited to, a ban for transfer of CCTV footage.

At all times whilst present in the Ground, persons must comply with any and all reasonable instructions and directions of any steward or officer of the Club, any police officer or any seated areas whilst play is in progress is strictly forbidden and may result in ejection from the Ground and, in addition, the Club may impose a ban (including, but not limited to, a ban for one or more Matches) and/or the removal of season ticket(s) for any such behaviour.

24. Any person found damaging or defacing the Ground may be prosecuted. 25. No re-entry to the Ground is permitted unless permission is given by an officer or a steward. 26. The Club reserves absolutely the right to refuse entry and eject from the Ground any person that fails (or in the Club's reasonable opinion is likely to fail) to comply with any of the

Welcome to Chadderton Football Club, and our home, The Emplas Commercial North Stadium!

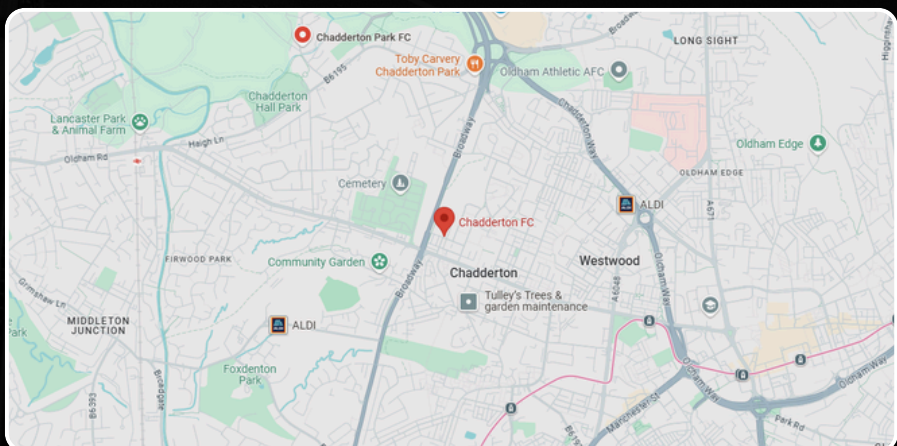
We are a football club that has recently been lucky enough to receive funding to have a brand-new 3G playing surface and new facilities at our home ground. We are delighted with how its all turned out and we hope it makes for some really exciting visits to our ground - for all fans.

If its your first time here at Chadderton FC, entry fee is taken on entry to the stadium, and can be paid in cash or card. Once in the stadium, you will be met with our carpark (which is free to use for paying fans), and our clubhouse. Our clubhouse is where our toilet facilities are, along with our bar and hospitality - just head upstairs if you are looking to grab a drink or take a seat in comfort, also be sure to enjoy the great view of the pitch from up there!

A bit further on from the clubhouse, if you carry on in the same direction, you will see one of our newest additions to our matchday experience here at Chadderton FC, Marlowes. Marlowes provides incredible matchday food for very reasonable prices and we cannot recommend trying them enough - try it and let us know what you think!

When the match starts, you have the freedom of all four sides of the pitch to choose where you would like to watch, the main stand is covered and offers seating, the area near the dugout allows you to get immersed with the game in a way you wouldn't experience at some levels, and there will also be quieter areas, which might be to others liking.

For fans looking to use public transport, The Emplas Commercial North Stadium is easy to reach by various methods. The nearest train station is Mills Hill, just over a mile away, with regular services from Manchester Victoria. Buses from both Oldham and Manchester city centre (such as the 59, 81, and 182) stop near Chadderton Precinct on Middleton Road, just a short walk from the ground.





# Our Story

We are Chadderton Football Club, based in Chadderton, Oldham, Greater Manchester. Currently competing in the North West Counties League Premier Division, we play our home matches at The Emplas Commercial North Stadium, our newly refurbished home ground with a state of the art 4G playing surface.

Our story began in 1946, when we were formed as Burnley Lane Estate Juniors, competing in the Middleton Youth League. Just a year later, we expanded with an adult team, moved to Mill Brow, and became Millbrow Football Club.

A few years and relocations later, we adopted the name North Chadderton Amateurs, competing in the Oldham Amateur League. In 1954–55, we lifted the league's Challenge Cup, a sign of things to come. The following season, we moved up to the Manchester Amateur League and won the North Division title in 1955–56, before finally becoming Chadderton Football Club in 1957.

In 1963, we were crowned Division One champions, and in the same period, we began competing in Division Two of the Manchester League. After a series of strong finishes, we won that division in 1964–65, and again in 1966–67, earning promotion to the Premier Division.

By 1980, we had taken the step up to the Lancashire Combination, and just two years later, we became founding members of the North West Counties League Division Two.

Our first taste of promotion in that league came in 1988–89, finishing third in Division Two. But the Premier Division proved tough, and we dropped back down a year later. We bounced back again in 1991–92, and while we faced challenges — including demotion in 1997–98 due to ground grading issues — we've never stopped pushing forward.

In 2014–15, we came close to promotion via the play-offs, narrowly losing out to AFC Darwen. Fast forward to the 2022–23 season, and history was made: after finishing runners-up in Division One North, we earned promotion the hard way — with back-to-back penalty shootout victories over Euxton Villa and FC St Helens.

We've come a long way since those early days as a youth club. From local leagues to pushing up the pyramid, Chadderton Football Club continues to grow both on and off the pitch — driven by passion, community, and the ambition to build something lasting that we can all be proud to pass on to future generations.

# Our Visitors

## South Liverpool

The name of South Liverpool FC first came about in the late 19<sup>th</sup> century. But it was when African Royal changed its name in December 1910 that South Liverpool FC first became a local name of importance. That club, which bears no connection with the our club, enjoyed success in its Dingle Lane home before the First World War but saw its fortunes change and by 1921 it had ceased and its remnants merged with New Brighton F.C.

One of its leading lights Mr W J Sawyer went on to be involved in both Everton FC and New Brighton FC. Our Clubman of the Year Trophy awarded annually is the WJ Sawyer Trophy kindly donated by the Sawyer family.

The modern club was founded in April 1935 to respond to the increasing south-end population and began playing in the 1935/36 season in the Lancashire Combination at Holly Park. Success was immediate and by the outbreak of the Second World War the Lancashire Combination had been won three times in succession as had the Lancashire Challenge Trophy and most impressively South defeated Cardiff City 2-1 in the Welsh Cup final at Wrexham in 1939. As that great conflict began South had moved in 1940 to link with the Cheshire League before hostilities drew a close to fully organised league football.

The club has 25 teams including open age, veterans, youth from Under 7 through to Under 18 and a seniors walking football team. Thier Jericho Lane Hub partners, Liverpool Feds Women, have an extensive range of womens teams, with their firts operating in the third level of the womens game in Engalnd, ensuring the South End of the city has a truly exciting football future.
