We are a football club that has recently been lucky enough to receive funding to have a brand-new 3G playing surface and new facilities at our home ground. We are delighted with how its all turned out and we hope it makes for some really exciting visits to our ground - for all fans.

If its your first time here at Chadderton FC, entry fee is taken on entry to the stadium, and can be paid in cash or card. Once in the stadium, you will be met with our carpark (which is free to use for paying fans), and our clubhouse. Our clubhouse is where our toilet facilities are, along with our bar and hospitality - just head upstairs if you are looking to grab a drink or take a seat in comfort, also be sure to enjoy the great view of the pitch from up there!

A bit further on from the clubhouse, if you carry on in the same direction, you will see one of our newest additions to our matchday experience here at Chadderton FC, Marlowes. Marlowes provides incredible matchday food for very reasonable prices and we cannot recommend trying them enough - try it and let us know what you think!

When the match starts, you have the freedom of all four sides of the pitch to choose where you would like to watch, the main stand is covered and offers seating, the area near the dugout allows you to get immersed with the game in a way you wouldn't experience at some levels, and there will also be quieter areas, which might be to others liking.

For fans looking to use public transport, The Emplas Commercial North Stadium is easy to reach by various methods. The nearest train station is Mills Hill, just over a mile away, with regular services from Manchester Victoria. Buses from both Oldham and Manchester city centre (such as the 59, 81, and 182) stop near Chadderton Precinct on Middleton Road, just a short walk from the ground.



Our Story

We are Chadderton Football Club, based in Chadderton, Oldham, Greater Manchester. Currently competing in the North West Counties League Premier Division, we play our home matches at The Emplas Commercial North Stadium, our newly refurbished home ground with a state of the art 4G playing surface.

Our story began in 1946, when we were formed as Burnley Lane Estate Juniors, competing in the Middleton Youth League. Just a year later, we expanded with an adult team, moved to Mill Brow, and became Millbrow Football Club.

A few years and relocations later, we adopted the name North Chadderton Amateurs, competing in the Oldham Amateur League. In 1954–55, we lifted the league's Challenge Cup, a sign of things to come. The following season, we moved up to the Manchester Amateur League and won the North Division title in 1955–56, before finally becoming Chadderton Football Club in 1957.

In 1963, we were crowned Division One champions, and in the same period, we began competing in Division Two of the Manchester League. After a series of strong finishes, we won that division in 1964–65, and again in 1966–67, earning promotion to the Premier Division.

By 1980, we had taken the step up to the Lancashire Combination, and just two years later, we became founding members of the North West Counties League Division Two.

Our first taste of promotion in that league came in 1988–89, finishing third in Division Two. But the Premier Division proved tough, and we dropped back down a year later. We bounced back again in 1991–92, and while we faced challenges — including demotion in 1997–98 due to ground grading issues — we've never stopped pushing forward.

In 2014–15, we came close to promotion via the play-offs, narrowly losing out to AFC Darwen. Fast forward to the 2022–23 season, and history was made: after finishing runners-up in Division One North, we earned promotion the hard way — with back-to-back penalty shootout victories over Euxton Villa and FC St Helens.

We've come a long way since those early days as a youth club. From local leagues to pushing up the pyramid, Chadderton Football Club continues to grow both on and off the pitch — driven by passion, community, and the ambition to build something lasting that we can all be proud to pass on to future generations.

Our Visitors Stockport Town FC

Stockport Town was founded in 2014. Based at Stockport Sports Village, the club began with ambitious aims to begin life at the tenth tier of the English football league system. Stockport Town suffered a setback in their plans after being unsuccessful in applying for the league. After positive meetings, the FA told Stockport Town they were not convinced that the club met the required standards for a new club attempting to join the North West Counties. Despite this, the club board were convinced that a year of development would only benefit the club's application chances. On 29 April 2015, three of the club's representatives travelled to Wembley to meet with the Leagues' Committee. They highlighted how the club had been successfully run over the past year, with encouraging results against some high-profile clubs from the region. On 14 May 2015, was accepted into the North West Counties Football League Division One for the 2015–16 season.

Calum Sykes was manager of the club for its first two full seasons. On 17 December 2016, Sykes announced that he was to resign, and later that same day he was announced as the manager of nearby club New Mills. On 6 January 2017, the club announced that Dave Wild, with previous experience of coaching at Northwich Victoria and Maine Road, would replace him. Wild's reign began away at FC Oswestry Town, where a rebuilt squad put a stop to consecutive defeats and earned a point in a 0–0 draw. Wild would lose just 4 out of 18 matches in his half-season in charge of the Lions, ending with a win rate of 50%, securing a tenth-place finish having scored 92 goals throughout the season.

On 29 March 2018, it was announced by the club that Wild and his backroom staff were to depart with immediate effect, joining Division One North club Mossley with U21s boss, Jake Davies, put in interim charge alongside his assistant Tom Upton. During their 11 games at the helm Jake and Tom finished with a better win percentage of previous managers Dave Wild and Calum Sykes combined in which concluded a tough season for the Lions. Concluding the 2017–18 season, the club appointed Alan Lord as manager for the new 2018–19 season with interim manager Jake Davies and Tom Upton taking up first team coaching roles for the upcoming season.
