## **East Devon B** Mid Somerset 1st XI

Knowing that a good result was imperative to revive their hopes of promotion, this was the most important game of the season to date for Mid Somerset. away to the league leaders East Devon. It was therefore not the game to turn in one of their most inept performances of the season, which saw them slip to a single goal defeat.

This game was a complete contrast to the earlier meeting between these two sides which resulted in an entertaining three-all draw.

Scoring chances for both teams were few and the goalkeepers from both sides had little to do.

East Devon took a first half lead but rarely threat-ened thereafter. Mids' best chance to equalise fell to

Martin White, with a shot that hit the post. From the rebound skipper Roger Knife also shot wide. Mids also wasted a couple of short corner opportunities. Will Steel had a solid performance in midfield, but

once again Mids failed to produce a result in Devon.

Mids' chances of promotion are now fading and they will probably have to rely on other teams slipping up if they are to find themselves back in promotion contention

This was another big win for Mid Somerset as they maintained their promotion challenge with a convincing victory at Minehead.

It was an excellent day for forward Dave Lennard. He scored a first half hat-trick and added another two in the second half.

Two goals were scored from tap-ins but the other three were trademark Lennard goals. The other goal

was scored by skipper Gavin Pa-tey.

Minehead offered little in attack with two young forwards who rarely troubled the Mids' defence,

which included Jody Wood as a makeshift full back. Gareth Searey and Steve Tinnion dominated the midfield area and were instrumental in setting up a number of scoring chances. With three league games remaining the team may only need one more win to clinch promotion.

Mids' away day hoodoo in Devon continued on Saturday with a controversial 2-1 defeat at Exeter Hornets.

With 12 minutes of the game remaining, a cross from the right by defender Mark Salvidge found skipper Roger Knife at the far post. He despatched the ball in the back of the net from two yards out and the homeappointed umpire initially awarded a goal.

However, as the ball went through a hole in the back of the net and ended up outside the goal, Hornets complained that the goal should not stand. Without consulting the second umpire or checking the net, the umpire then disallowed the goal and resumed play with a hit out. Mids were so incensed that they have lodged an appeal to the league.

An equalising goal would have made any result possible in the last 10 minutes and there is nothing worse than losing a game under such circumstances. The umpire did admit after the game that there was a hole in the net but this counts for nothing unless the league come to Mids rescue.

The last 10 minutes of the game was frantic, but Mids were unable to score again. They did take a one-nil lead in the first half thanks to an Andy Berry goal, but Hornets equalised before the break and took the lead early in the second period.

Mids were thwarted by a spectacular display from the Hornets' keeper who had kept his side in the game with a series of fine saves, before the incident with the disallowed goal.
